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PUBLIC PROCUREMENT IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC: WHAT CAN DATA TELL US ABOUT THE BEHAVIOR OF AUTHORITIES?

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Abstract

The Czech Republic spends approximately 17.5% of its GDP on public procurement, which makes it, in relation to GDP, the second largest public procurement market within the OECD countries. The study analyzes the behavior of authorities within the fields of public procurement and by means of quantitative methods unveils the basic behavioral patterns. We demonstrate the impact of the institutional framework on their behavior and highlight the consequences for the procurement costs and degree of competition.
